

Bharat Nirman Scheme and Its Influence on Women's Empowerment in Marathwada Region

Abstract:

This research paper focused on the impact of the Bharat Nirman Scheme (BNS) on women empowerment in the Marathwada region. While considering the rural women empowerment by BNS, it has played a vital role through India in the rural area. Marathwada region is an underdeveloped region. Out of total population in Marathwada, women's are 48.22% according to the population census 2011 of India. The research is based on both primary as well as secondary sources of information. It has selected 240 rural women in Aurangabad, as a sample from Aurangabad, Beed, Nanded and Hingoli districts of Marathwada Region on the random sample selection technique. Survey has taken with the support of the interview schedule. The various questions were asked to beneficiaries of these two schemes and the analyses of the questionnaire. The assessment of BNS is limited to only safe drinking water and rural housing.

Introduction:

Women empowerment is a decisive factor in the process of the development at national, provincial, village and community levels. Emphasizing the role of women in society, Jawaharlal Nehru had said: "Women should be uplifted for the upliftment of the nation, for if women are uplifted society and nation are uplifted too" (Menon, 2004).

The empowerment of women entitles the prospects of leading to the assured progressive growth of a society. This can only be achieved by allowing women to have their say in familial, social, economic and political spheres.

Meaning of Women Empowerment

Empowering women means to enable women to do certain things and in most cases, it connotes women wielding political power. Viewed in a broad spectrum, the very concept of empowerment of the women which is based on equality between genders is a continuous and conscious process comprising enhancement of skills, capacity building gaining self-confidence and meaningful participation in decision making. It helps them articulate their as well as others' right and participate actively in the democratic processes (Duwarah, 2015).

After independence, the government of India took several steps in favour of women's empowerment in India. They tried to make equality in gender i.e. equality in male and female. The process of women empowerment started in the first five-year plan in 1950. In 11th five year plan there have been efforts to the empowerment of women's included in plan objective. (आपटे ज. श., २००८). On January 31, 1992, the Union Government of India established a National Women Commission to study the problems of women in India. Many state government follow the union government and

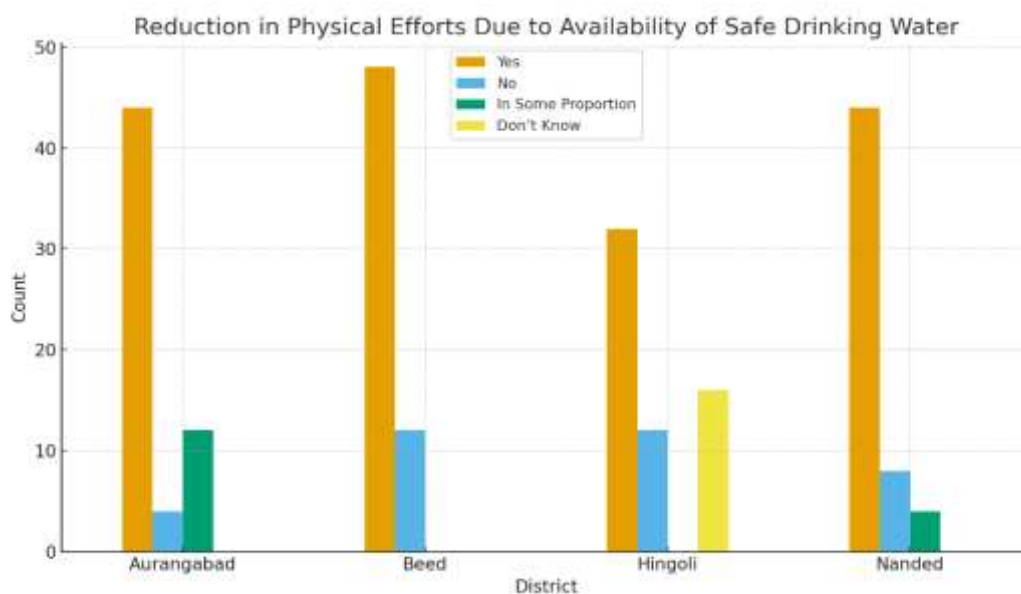
Due to the BNS, the empowerment of women is studied on the ground of filling up questionnaires. In Marathwada, classification of the female respondent based on age group is 21-30 aged 1.7%, 31-40 aged 21.7%, 41-50 aged 36.7% and above 51 aged are 40% respectively. Classification of the female respondent based on category I found that in open category females are 36.7% in OBC 25%, in SC 31.7% and ST 6.7% etc. based on religion 70% belongs to Hindu, 3.3% belong to Muslim and 26.7% belongs to Bauddha respectively.

While studying about the marital status of the female's respondent, it is found that 96.7% married, 1.7% divorced and 1.7% are widow. Educational status is as -36.7% primary, 18.3% secondary, 5% higher secondary, 1.7% UG/PG and 38.3% females are uneducated respectively. 26.7% lives in joint family while 73.3% lives in Separate family.

Under BNS in villages due to the drinking water availability 70% female said that physical efforts are reduced, which includes, lifting water from wells, bringing water from far away, bringing water from hand pump etc. And the proportion of physical labour changes over the season to season in the rural area. In summer to bring drinking water for animals is challenging in the rural area. Because the groundwater level of wells goes down. 15% of the female respondent replayed negative and 15% said in some proportion physical efforts reduced.

Due to the bringing drinking water far away from the home, if there any illness faced by you? While answering this question in Marathwada region 58.3% response are positive by this it is clear that female members of that family have to face a lot of illness problems, it includes, knee ache, headache, etc. 36.7% response is negative and 3.3% said in some proportion and 1.7% said 'Don't Know'.

Does women's statuses in society are increased due to the house registered on her name? to answer this question 53.3% respondent said 'Yes' because the amounts of *Gharkul* releases on the name of female owner members of family and society gives respects to her. Ultimately she feels that the social status increased. 25% of the total female respondent said 'No' and 3.3% said don't know while 18.3 % female respondent said 'in some proportion'.

While knowing about the house and safe drinking water system under Bharat Nirman Scheme, in Marathwada region 43.3% of the total respondent response is positive, 18.3% are negative and 36.7% said 'in some proportion'.

Conclusions:

Efforts are decreased to bring water for daily use of rural women due to the BNS. Safe drinking water supplies in many villages empowered the health of women and decrease the epidemics. Confidence among the women's is increasing because of IAY under BNS house benefited on their name. While implementing the schemes of rural development the reservation principle for women should be obeyed. Because after a survey it is found that because of having a house on women's name, the member of the family and other people do respects to that women.

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
