**NOVO ECIJANO'S FESTIVAL: It's Influences on (SCENE) Socio-Cultural,
ENvironmental, and Economic Aspect of Local People in the Province of Nueva Ecija,
Philippines**

Abstract

The study focused on the impact of socio-cultural, economic and environmental aspects to the perception of respondents in terms of festival components namely: Safety and Security, Festival Spirit, Contest and Activities, Promotion and Production Roles. This study also aimed to determine the significant relationship of the respondents' profile. This study was conducted from March to May 2019 at the Nueva Ecija University of Science and Technology-Gabalton Campus. The identified festivals were from five (5) cities/municipalities who are known for their famous festivals namely, Gabaldon (Gulayan Festival), Cabanatuan City (Banatu Festival), Bongabon (Sibuyas Festival), Aliaga (Taong Putik), Muñoz (Lantern Festival). The study is limited only in describing the influences of Novo Ecijano's festivals towards the following aspects; socio-cultural, economic and environmental as being perceived by the local people. Quantitative description design of research was used in this study. Respondents were chosen by the use of purposive sampling techniques while collection of data was conducted through survey questionnaire. The said tool was validated using face to face and pilot testing approach. The gathered responses were computed using the different statistical tools (percentage, frequency distribution, weighted mean and Pearson r' respectively).

Based on the findings and results of the study, the following conclusions were drawn. The respondents strongly recommend that the municipalities are free from terrorism and LGU officials are prepared during emergency results show that they have enough police security

available during festivities and the organizer conducts and develops comprehensive security plan. The respondents strongly recommend that celebration of festival aids in the preservation of traditional beliefs, customs and traditions, time to reunite with relatives and friends and celebration of festival commemorates religious influence and honor Patron Saints. Furthermore, the study shows that dancing competition is one of the most awaited competition during festivals and is well participated by different agencies in the area. It was manifested that the respondents strongly agree that celebrations of festivals enhance community spirit and brings opportunity for dominant population to view other cultures. However, the respondents slightly agree that celebration of festivals causes traffic, increases crime and waste to the community. The respondents strongly agree that local community have the opportunity to showcase their skills and abilities and that festivals take seasonal source of income for the locals, increases the prices of goods and services, inadequate estimation of costs of event, money lost through leakage, shortage of supply due to increase numbers of tourists, negative reactions from existing enterprises due to the possibility of new competition for local manpower and government assistance, failure to attracts tourists. The respondents strongly agree that festivals preserve a rich heritage handed down from our ancestors and they agree that improvement of local infrastructure in the community, enhances waste management practices due to festivals, preserves the existing public/historical buildings, construction of new facilities. The respondents agree that celebrating festivals increases waste in a local community and they slightly agree that celebrating festival causes noise pollution, overcrowding, ecological damage, environmental community destroy the places where festivals took places. The study suggested that the LGU in cooperation with the City/ Municipal Tourism Office may develop a comprehensive long term tourism development plan anchored to the result of this study which is for the advancement of the tourism sector.

Introduction

Tourism is one of the largest global industries in the last 50 years (Coccosis & Parpaire, 1995). It is recognized as the main contributor in the progress of many countries. Specifically, tourism has contributed greatly to providing foreign exchange, enhanced local economies, community pride, awareness, and improved development of public services (Hassan, 2000; Long et al., 1990). 1.5 billion international tourist arrivals were recorded in 2019, globally. A 4 % increase on the previous year which is also forecast for 2020, confirming tourism as a leading and resilient economic sector, especially in view of current uncertainties. By the same token, this calls for such growth to be managed responsibly so as to best seize the opportunities tourism can generate for communities around the world (UNWTO, 2020). With its growth, many allied fields are also being stimulated within the tourism industry, one of them is special events.

Nowadays, the link between tourism and events have expanded rapidly (Higham & Hinch, 2002), and many forms of special events have emerged. The growth of special events in numbers, diversity, and popularity has contributed to the parallel increase in festivals, which are organized temporarily at one location by a small group of persons (Gursoy et al., 2004).

Festivals are an important field within event tourism industry, and have increased tremendously in the past decades and become one of the fastest growing sectors. (Getz, 2005) defined festivals as themed public celebrations which were held regularly and annually in the same location or held periodically in different locations. Festivals provide unique opportunities for visitors to participate in a distinct experience from everyday life (Getz and Frisby, 1988). Festival organizers celebrate their culture and lifestyle, while they share a variety of experiences with local and outside visitors. At the same time, festivals help enhance and preserve local cultures, especially when festivals become local traditions after many years of celebration (Yolal, Cetinel, & Uysal, 2009). They provide an appropriate and periodic time for people to come together and have fun. Nowadays, large cities and small communities both have venues and facilities to promote various festivals each year. Festivals have increased dramatically in numbers, also including size, number of visitors, and stakeholders over the past few years and still continue to do so.

The rapid growth of festivals has brought physical improvements to the host community. For example, added infrastructure through improvement such as new facilities and venues, renewed city image, enhanced sense of community pride and involvement, and enriched cultural activities. In addition, the nature of a festival and improvements going along with

festival's development may create sociocultural impacts on the community and residents (Yolal et al., 2009). The sociocultural impact of festivals results from the interaction between hosts', or local people, and guests, or tourists (Wang, 2015), and can be regarded as changes in customs, lifestyles, values, cultural and social activities. These changes may encourage the level of community support and involvement in the festival, as well as result in community dissatisfaction and rejection. Therefore, it is important to understand the sociocultural impact of festivals to a host community.

Festivals, as one type of event are a growing phenomenon in the Philippines, evidence of which are the numerous celebrated festivals not only per province but in every municipality as well. Energetic marching bands, processions of patron saints, sumptuous foods, lively parades, colorful floats, vibrant costumes, amateur singing or dancing competitions, competitive street dancing showdowns, beauty pageants, miss gay competitions, local makeshift shopping stores that come from different parts of the province, and many more. These are just some of the views that a Filipino fiesta has, they are rooted with religious beliefs of thanking the village's patron saint or deities for blessing the place with abundance of resources.

Hosting a festival can directly benefit the economic, environment and socio cultural aspects of the host community, however, negative effects of tourism is also may set out major dimensions of current methods and practices on major festivals in the province (Nueva Ecija, Philippines), identifying best practices which will help organizers and government authorities in evaluating and assessing their celebrated festivals in attainment of the ultimate goal which is sustainability.

The study focused on the impact of Socio- Cultural, Economic and Environmental Aspects to the perception of respondents in terms of Festival Components namely: Safety and Security, Festival Spirit, Contest and Activities, Promotion and Production Roles. Moreover, the study also aiming to determine the significant relationship of the respondents' profile and the latter. The identified festivals will be coming from five (5) cities/municipalities who are known for their famous conduct of festivals namely, Gabaldon (Gulayan Festival), Cabanatuan (Banatu Festival), Bongabon (Sibuyas Festival), Aliaga (Taong Putik), Muñoz (Lantern Festival). The study is limited only in describing the influences of Novo Ecijano's festivals towards the following aspects; socio-cultural, economic and environmental as being perceived by the local people.

The researchers strongly believed that there is a need to conduct this study to gauge and identify such problems that may arise in the field of Hospitality and Tourism to seek

solutions and answers to come up with a comprehensive analysis on the SCENE of the festivals in the province.

Methods

Quantitative description design of research was used in this study. Respondents were chosen by the use of purposive sampling techniques. Collection of data through survey questionnaire. The said tool was validated using face to face and pilot testing approach. The gathered responses were computed using the different statistical tools (percentage, frequency distribution, weighted mean and Pearson r’.

Results and Discussions

Table 1 shows the distribution of the respondents in terms of age. Based on the data presented, respondents ages 21-25 top the results having a total average of 29%, Followed by the ages 26-30 which consists of 23%, while 17% of the total population belonged to the ages

40 above, 31-40, and ages 18-20 consist the total average of 9%. And the least of the respondents were at the age bracket from 18 below with a total average of 6%. In this regards, according to (BJELJAC and LOVIL, 2011) in their study the demographic analysis of foreign visitors to the exit festival. Most of the attendees in festivals were in the age group of 20-30 years. It can be seen that 62% of respondents were females, and 38% were male. According to Vagianos, 2016. Thirty-two million people attend festivals every year in the U.S over half (51 percent) of those attendees are women. 74 out of 100 belonged were Roman Catholic. Following were affiliated to Born Again Christian who got 19% while 6% of the respondents belonged to Iglesia Ni Cristo. 1% has no religion.

Table 2 presented the over-all rating of the respondents in relation to safety and security as one of the festival component. This table indicates that most of the respondents “Strongly Recommends” that the municipalities is free from terrorism, LGU officials are prepared during emergency, and recommends that there are enough police security and Brgy. Police available during festivities, the organizer conducted and developed comprehensive security plan, deployment of standard guard supervisor, overnight guards, police, medical personnel and fire marshals, there is a well coordination among affected department in the municipality. And they “Recommends” that there is enough and necessary security and safety infrastructure and equipment, the organizer created an ingress/engress plan, taking into account any requirements by the fire department for blowout gates/emergency exits, during event, the organizer provides and distribute security pass boards, there are provided ample and safe parking spaces for any kinds of vehicles.

In this regard, to keep a festival safe its essential that certain security measures should be given the highest priority, and here are some that should be at the top of the list. Festivals tend to have one main entrance, and it’s where security should begin, as well as allow the staff to set the tone for how security will be handled for the entirety of the event.

Festivals are a time of celebration, a time of commemoration. Every culture, every community across the world, has special days or periods that are set aside for the ritual celebration of special events; these events may be religious or socio-culture, or mark points in seasonal or agricultural cycles. Festivals may be local, observed only by a small group of people in a particular place, or they may be observed by a larger group of people, spread out across a country or countries. Festivals also perform a social function: they bring a group of people together, binding them in ties that transcend family, even village or town, thus engendering feelings of belonging to a larger community, whether socio-cultural or religious. Festivals also help in the preservation of traditional beliefs and customs, and in their transmission from one generation to the next. This aspect is particularly important in primitive societies without written records where the ritual recital of tribal stories and the only way to preserve and transmit traditional lore.

And they “Recommends” that Beauty Pageants (female/gay/male) are also included in the festival activity, Traditional Filipino Games are always remembering and executed during event, Local Product Exhibits is also present during festival, Participation of Indigenous People is also observed during festival.

With regards of contest and activities, it is in dance that Filipinos are particularly eloquent, just as easily as they pastry, Pinoy’s find an excuse to dance for fitness and leisure to entertain visitors to give thanks or as a social valve for relationships. At the Aliwan Fiesta, dance in its myriad forms takes center stage, as interpreted in the festival context by contingent from various regions all over the country.

Festivals are collective phenomena and serve purposes rooted in group life. Systems of reciprocity and of shared responsibility ensure the continuity of and participation in the festival through the distribution of prestige and production.

Community festival are traditionally organized by and for the local community, and often celebrate a theme that has developed from within the community itself. It provides members of a community with opportunities to engage in socialization, entertainment and the establishment of social networks, which can contribute to the enhancement of community cohesion and the building of social capital within a community additionally, they can provide tourism benefits such as increased visitation and promotion of a destination’s image.

And they “Disagree” that celebration of festival may lead to misunderstanding leading to varying degrees of host/visitor hostility, celebration may lead to culture shock among locals and visitors.

The development of tourism induces changes in the social character of a destination. Tourism is a globalized business activity and thus presents growing challenges in terms of traditional social culture. With the continuous development of the tourism industry, traditional social culture has changed drastically. (Zhuang, X., Yao, Y., Li, J., 2019)

And they “Agree” that the local community increases profitability and revenue for re-investment, increase of standard of living among locals, celebrating festivals hosts potential investors and promoting new business opportunities, increase in labor supply, the Inns, Lodgings, or accommodations benefitted in festival celebrations.

Communities experience a range of benefits from special events and festivals. These benefits include building social cohesion, providing a specific time and place for families and friends to show their commitment to the area, to provide public goods beyond entertainment and to provide a socially acceptable area for public actions. (Rao V., 2001). A community will also experience a number of economic benefits from special events and festivals. These benefits can include looking at the number of participants that attend the event and the estimated

dollar value per event. (Terry et.al.,2009) these benefits help to determine the overall economic impact of the event.

According to (Wahengbam, 2013) in celebrating festivals the people spend a huge amount of money unnecessarily on expensive things. During festival the prices of essential goods are sky high. However, things are continuously bought. Festivals also enhance the level of corruption. All these numerous festivals in turn affect the economy.

Based on a news article published in (Envirotech-online.com, 2018) Every year, 3.17 million people attend music festivals up and down the length and breadth of Britain. It is an opportunity for the people to get away on their daily routines. However, the impact of UK festivals have on the planet should not be underestimated as the festival itself produces 23,500 tons of waste, use five million liters of fuel and emit almost 20,000 tons of carbon dioxide every single year.

Conclusion

Based on the findings and results of the study the following conclusions were drawn: The respondents believed that the municipalities are free from terrorism, LGU officials are prepared during emergencies and they have enough police security available during festivities, the organizers were also conducted and developed comprehensive security plan. The respondents "Strongly Recommends" that celebration of festival aids in the preservation of traditional beliefs, customs and traditions, time to reunite with relatives and friends and celebration of festival commemorates religious influence and honor Patron Saints. The respondents "Strongly Recommends" that one of the contests during festival is the much awaited street dancing competition and is well participated by different agencies in the area. It was manifested that the respondents "Strongly agree" that celebrations of festivals enhances community spirit and brings opportunity for dominant population to view other cultures. The respondents "Slightly agree" that Celebration of festivals causes traffic, increases crime and waste to the community. The respondents "Strongly Agree" that local community have the opportunity to showcase their skills and abilities. The respondents "Strongly Agree" that festivals takes seasonal source of income for the locals, increasing the prices of goods and services, inadequate estimation of costs of event, money lost through leakage, shortage of supply due to increase numbers of tourists, negative reactions from existing enterprises due to the possibility of new competition for local manpower and government assistance, failure to attracts tourists. The respondents "Strongly Agree" that festivals preserves a rich heritage handed down from our ancestors. And they "Agree" that improvement of local infrastructure in the community, local community enhances waste management practices due to festivals, local community preserves the existing public/historical buildings due to festival, construction of new facilities. The respondents "Agree" that Celebrating festivals increases waste in a local community. And they "Slightly Agree" that Celebrating festival causes noise pollution, Overcrowding, Ecological Damage, Environmental community can be destroyed where festivals are taking place. The Local Government Unit in cooperation with the City/ Municipal Tourism Office may develop a comprehensive long term tourism development plan anchored to the result of this study for the advancement of the tourism sector.
