Identity or ahankara (not ego), as per the Yogic philosophy is a vital part of our mental body Which if not understood properly can create serious problems (passions) like jealousy, anger, greed, illusion, sensation, intoxication, attachment (bandha or bondage as per Jain philosophy). The wise words above became the base of globalisation, which roughly started 200 years back and witnessed the rapid growth and expansion in the late nineties. People today often have a misconception

about identity and normally get entangled at a lower level identity. This tendency creates a plethora of problems.

These words carry a very deeper sense. To understand the hidden message one has to understand the concept of identity or *ahankara*.

It gained speed and rapidity after about 100 years of initiation which turned into a cyclone till the late last century. The process of globalization can be political, social, ecological, cultural, economic, geographical etc. The major symptoms of globalization are easy cross border trade in terms of services, dominant service trade, more innovations and research etc.

Now we are witnessing all these across the nations on this planet. Just imagine to extend the concept across the planets, which may become possible technically in few years from now. If we talk of extending the same concept across the galaxies (in the cosmos). Can we call it planetization, galaxization anyway?

1.1 LITERATURE REVIEW

Ahankaara or ego as per Vedic scriptures refers to identity. Human being has been said as the co-existence of physical body and self or 'I'. (Sadhguru,2019) The body is again divided into two parts namely Physical body and mental body. The physical body comprises of brain or *mastishk*, the primary instrument and karmendriyas or action organs and *gyanendriyas* or sensory organs called together as secondary instrument. Mental body has got four parts namely intellect or *buddhi*, *ahankara* or identity (not ego), *manas* or memory or mind and *chitt* or mind stuff or pure intelligence. (Sadhguru,2019) This can be made more clear after seeing the sketch below:




Figure 1: Human Being Explored

The last column in the above table (Deshpande, 2015) shows what actually we are cultivating, problems, problems and only problems. (FDP AICTE,2021). We will find prima facie only one root cause to the problem and that is education *sanskaar*. But on deep penetration, logical reasoning and focussed analysis some more causes will surface.

1.2 CAUSES FOR THE ISSUES BEING CONFRONTED TODAY

The major causes as we see which are responsible for these conditions of struggle, exploitation, obsession etc. can be broadly categorize into three parts. Formal education, informal education and identity. Formal education we all know what we are imparting in the schools, colleges, universities in form of Moral Value, Human Value etc. Much has been written on this and lot of literature is existing. Informal education in form of external expression, (treatment, behaviour etc. with other units of all natural orders) in family / society/nature/existence. Third cause, which we are going to focus here is the *ahankaara* or identity.

Let us revisit the figure 1. How and where the things go wrong depends on the mental body which comprises of the intellect, the identity, the mind or memory and the mind stuff or the pure intelligence or the intelligence without memory.

34th. Shloka of Shrimad Bhagwadgeeta (Chapter 6: Dhyan Yog) says

चञ्चलं हि मनः कृष्ण प्रमाथि बलवद्दढम् ।

तस्याहं निग्रहं मन्ये वायोरिव सुदुष्करम्॥

cañcalan hi manah kṛṣṇa pramāthi balavaddṛḍham.

tasyāhan nigrahan manyē vāyōriva suduşkaram / 16.34 / /

This means that the mind / mental body is so robust, strong and crazy that it becomes very difficult to control it like stopping the air flow. (Bhaktivedanta,2014)

It has been well said in commentary on the *Katha Upanishad* in the section 3 titled *Sadhana*:

ātmānam rathinam viddhi, śarīram rathameva tu:

buddhim tu sāradhim viddhi, manaḥ pragraham eva ca. (3)

Which means that soul within the chariot is the rider; the body is the chariot. The charioteer is the intellect or reason. The mind is like reigns with which the horses are connected to the chariot.

Further next shloka says

indriyāṇi hayān āhur viṣayāms teşu gocarān,

ātmendriya-mano-yuktam bhoktety āhur manīşiṇaḥ. (4)

Which means that senses are the horses, the objects are the roads along which the chariot is driven; the self, associated with the body, the senses and the mind—the wise say—is the enjoyer. (Bhahtivedanta,2014), Swami Krishnananda (2017)

Thus the root causes can be four as mentioned below:

- a. The way we use our intellect or *buddhi*. If the intellect is governed by the *satvik* imagination body will do the noble things else the things can differ.
- b. The way we understand our identity or *ahankaara*. *Satvik* identity, *rajsik* identity and *tamsik* identity can give us different outcomes.
- c. The way / type of memory creates rippling impact (*vritis*) in our mind stuff.
- d. The form our mind stuff takes as a result of rippling(*vritis*).

Here we are going to focus on identity. Identity or *ahankaara* can be *satvik*, *rajsik* and *tamsik* as per *Sankhya darshan*. (Amin, Sharma et al.,2015)

Further we recognise a multilevel identity starting from name (lower most) and going to highest level the cosmos. But before that let us look at the following points carefully.

- Christchurch Mosque killings in New Zealand in 2019. (BBC, 2021)
- Manchester United and Liverpool supporters clash over the game.

- Consumerism and planned obsolescence. (The story of Stuff, 2009)
- Conflicts at workplace, in community, in society.
- Struggle in a family.
- Political ideology struggle and killings in West Bengal polls. (TNN ,2021)
- Contradiction within.

In all the situations mentioned above whatever be the explicit causes but implicit cause is identity and only identity.

Starting from bottom contradiction is always within as due to ignorance most of us identify as a physical body and name given to it. This includes the name, relations etc. Outcome is reflected in our external wellbeing. When I am not happy within how can I make others happy? (Tripathy, 2021)

Next we identify as per the demography(caste, culture, religion, ethnicity, nationality etc.). Struggles on the demographic basis are old & very common. The hatred is up to the extent of killing you, if you do not endorse their ideology.

At the next level we identify on the basis of our philosophy. This what we call differentiation of society, community (age, gender, post, wealth, ism, sects etc.). (Gaur et al. 2010, Tripathy 2021)


Creativity and imagination permits us to go beyond that i.e. planet, galaxies and the cosmos. But technology and innovation may restrict us on that account. We are caught in a trap, called 'lower identity trap'.

We are making immense efforts in getting out of this trap. Social, cultural, technological, spiritual awakening will help us to get rid of this. This will lead to the formation of a borderless world

(cosmos/planets/galaxies) and hence Undivided society. The day we will identify ourselves as a part of cosmic energy all the clashes resulting due to lower level identity will diffuse. This is the concept of cosmic identity. Very few have been able to follow this understanding till date and the results are in front of us. (Pandey, 2020) We observe clashes at some or other level due to some or other explicit reason. Abraham Maslow in his pyramid based approach too identifies it as the highest level or Self actualisation. One who attains this stage experiences bliss or joy or anand. (Gaur et al.,2020) Most of us are trapped at a lower level of the pyramid (physiological, safety, social, self-esteem) we call it identity. (Deshpande, 2016) (Blum & Naylor, 1968)

1.3 PYRAMID OF HIERARCHY OF IDENTITY

Depending on the discussion done in the previous section we propose a pyramid of hierarchy of identity.



The pyramid is engulfed in a circle named *chitt* or mind stuff or pure intelligence due to their property of taking any identity form as a result of ripples or *vritis* arising out of memory, imagination, dreams etc. Now as we get enhanced realization in form of right understanding as a result of right education *sanskaar*, right understanding leading to rise in the competence level, we keep on stepping the next level of identity. As we strive to move up the pyramid there are the forces which try to obstruct our upward movement. These anti forces can be preconditioning, assumptions, sensations, acceptance, ignorance (all internal), wrong education *sanskaar*, lower competence, technology (external) etc. One

interesting thing to be noticed that we bypass extra-terrestrial identity and galactic identity and reach the highest level of cosmic identity. It happens perhaps due to ignorance about these two. Present technology prohibits us / rather slow our pace of inquisitiveness for these two. The current trend is however not encouraging. So, if it continues, and more we explore the cosmos, we may face more resistance in our journey to get aware of our cosmic identity.
