It also has a negative effect on the nervous system, and as a result, they become nervous and angry, causing various injuries to their loved ones.

In order to prevent these tragedies, it is necessary to protect young people from harmful attacks on the Internet, to teach them to use information technology effectively, to take responsibility for each of us and to take joint measures. Today, the head of state pays special attention to young people, attracts them to culture, arts, physical culture and sports. , attention is being paid to increasing women's employment. We, the youth, must recognize that our main goal is to work for the future of our country in response to these opportunities, to become qualified personnel for the development of the industry.

In Israel, a special ultrasound device has been developed. It can be used to determine the age of the user. If he's young, he won't automatically go to obscene sites. In the United Arab Emirates, access to the global network is provided through the only Internet provider in the country - Etisalat. In Saudi Arabia, a complex method called "Internet national" has been developed, which filters the addresses of users and messages sent. The implication is that we, as adults, need to protect and guide future generations who are going through their childhood and entering a new life.

The inscription on the tomb of one of the pharaohs, who lived 3,500 years ago: confirms that it has been one of the key issues at all stages. Another example is the great philosopher of antiquity, Socrates, who once said, "Oh, where are these young people going?" Ibrat, the son of Ishaq Khan Junaydullakhankhoja, one of the Jadids of his time, wrote in his articles about the extravagance of weddings, excessive spending on surfing, and the fact that young people are more interested in running than in education. expresses his views on his hobbies. It shows that knowledge is the power to protect people from all kinds of evil. He writes: "A man without knowledge is a wall without foundation. An unfounded wall is very insignificant. We need science, we need morality, we need modern science. " With these thoughts, Ibrat encourages modern youth to be fully aware of the secular knowledge of their time.

The Jadids focused on the moral and spiritual upbringing of the people and called on them to refrain from various foreign cultures and morals. A. Cholpon's views in this area are very exemplary. "... O relatives! Our great request is that we should not imitate and imitate European fashion, glass, and immorality, but imitate the cultures of science, science, craft, and industry. Europe's fashion and immorality will leave you homeless, homeless, and captive. Avoid it !!! European schools, madrassas, science, industry, and other cultures can make you prosperous, administrative, and scholarly, and free you from the bondage of ignorance. Brethren, open your eyes and think!!!"²
