The Effect of Electronic Bullying on Teaching Process

Abstract

The study is concerned with the efforts that are directed to reduce direct and indirect bullying in its traditional forms: verbal, physical and emotional, the existence of another form of bullying that is no less important than other forms is electronic bullying, in which the bully uses electronic means in his actions against others. We find that its culture is less or almost non-existent among the community, the school and the family, so this topic was to shed light on the nature of cyberbullying, its methods, the damages resulting from it, and the role of the family, school and society in treating cyberbullying.

Introduction

And because bullying is originally a crime punishable by the street as a result of causing harm to the other party, it is also when using various technologies as a cybercrime tool to produce electronic bullying that has caused harm to many people, especially teenagers, you can take a short tour on the Internet or see some research published since In 2003 you find a significant number of stories and events resulting from electronic bullying that were the talk of the world, and the matter developed further with the launch of the modern generation of technology, which greatly helped the speed of communication in its various forms, text, audio and video direct and indirect, which in many cases led to breaking the limits of freedom Personal.

1-Definition of cyberbullying

Wikipedia states that bullying is the use of the Internet and related technologies to harm others in intentional, repetitive, and aggressive ways.

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Another source, The Bahraini Women's Society – Human Development stated that cyber-bullying is working to inflict harm on the other party by using electronic devices connected to the Internet such as tablets.

We define cyber-bullying as a hostile act carried out by the cyber-bully using modern technology against another party with the aim of causing him physical, moral, social and psychological harm. (Khalifa, G. 2011).

2-Forms of cyber bullying

With the expansion of the use of the information network (the Internet) in various transactions and the entry of all segments of society to the list of users, electronic bullying began to appear and developed with time and its forms varied, from forms and images of electronic bullying, (Al-Qahtani, T. A. 2012).:

-Threatening messages that arrive from an unknown source to the mail or personal account in an application and the repetition of the act.

-Socially and morally inappropriate comments on a private photo, article or video posted on the Internet and circulated among the community. Filming without the knowledge of the other party and publishing his photos on various means of communication with the aim of causing harm to him.

-Publishing real or modified photos in which the other party appears in a position that others do not wish to see.

-Spreading rumors or information about the other party with the aim of insulting or tarnishing reputation.

-Intellectual property rights and information corruption and misuse.

-Spying through applications designed with the aim of penetrating privacy.

-Unauthorized and illegal access to networks with the aim of harming others.

-Harassment and extortion through multiple electronic communication channels.

-A phone call from a known or unknown party in which he spreads rumors about another party with the aim of harming the other and tarnishing his reputation.

-Impersonation, posting various electronic posts that are offensive to others.

-Deception and leakage of information that the other party absolutely does not want anyone to know.

-First, the role of the school

• Training the various school cadres on the cases that may result from the occurrence of cyberbullying.

• Preparing cultural awareness programs that explain the nature of cyberbullying.

• Take advantage of the morning program (school radio) to introduce cyber-bullying.

Preparing a qualified and preventive school team that has tasks to achieve, and works to collect observations and phenomena that indicate the existence of electronic bullying in the school.

• Urging students and gaining their confidence to report cases of cyberbullying that they may be exposed to.

• Announcing from the school administration the legal penalties that may affect the perpetrator.

• Increasing oversight in places where electronic bullying can occur more than others, such as rooms where computers are located (computer labs – learning resource centers). (Al-Qahtani, T. A. 2012).

- Parents' role

• Monitoring children when they use electronic devices and various communication programs. (Al-Maraghi, A. A. :2017).

• Reviewing the websites they visit frequently and getting to know what the material provided by those websites.

• Establishing family laws that can limit the occurrence of electronic bullying cases, such as not talking to unknown people, not opening any message from an unknown party.

• The importance of informing one of the parents in the event of any cyber-bullying cases.

• Determining times for using electronic devices and social media programs, and the matter is not wide for the children.

• The importance of cooperation and communication with the school administration in this regard.

• The role of cooperative societies

• Spreading awareness of the dangers of cyberbullying among members of society through awareness programmes.

• Cooperating with relevant authorities, such as specialized institutes and universities, in holding seminars. (Al-Qahtani, T. A. 2012).

• All roles are complementary to each other and lead to a positive result if they are presented appropriately and effectively among the various segments, and the task falls on everyone in cases of cyber-bullying and that the matter goes beyond being a rare occurrence, and we find that children and adolescents are in line with technology and technical development much more than adults , and you can imagine the shortcuts in communication that teens understand in communicating with others through various communication programs.

6. The role of the Teacher in treating bullying

The role of the Teacher in treating bullying is great, as bullying has become one of the most common problems of the era, and because of it psychological problems increase in society, and this in turn affects its construction. And its cohesion, as it then begins to fall little by little, so we must trace the cause of this problem, as well as know the ways to treat it, which the teacher will certainly play a big role in, so we must know the best ways to treat bullying, and the role of the school in that.

The teacher must always educate himself, and keep up to date with everything new in dealing with students.
